Today's Readings

Isaiah 58.1-9; 1 Corinthians 2.1-12; Matthew 5.13-20

Today, in the famous teaching in Matthew about salt and light, we are encouraged to recognise that ordinary things can make a difference. Jesus uses two vivid metaphors, salt and light, necessary to human flourishing. Just as real salt (as opposed to salt mixed with impurities) does not lose its taste, so disciples do not lose their capacity to season their surroundings with God's blessing.

The second image centres on visibility. Just as it is ridiculous to hide a light, so it is foolish to suggest that committed disciples will be invisible through failing to do God's work. Both images describe the disciples' mission in terms often used for Israel's, such as their 'light breaking forth like the dawn' of Isaiah 58. Like Israel, the purpose of the disciples' activity is to glorify God, not themselves.

In the passage from 1 Corinthians Paul maintains that human wisdom alone is not enough to communicate the good news. It is only through the gifts of the Holy Spirit that Christ can be fully known, and the shocking truth that the cross is at the heart of his ministry be appreciated.
