#### Today's Readings (8am only)

#### Third Sunday Before Advent

Wisdom 6.12-16; 1 Thessalonians 4.13-18; Matthew 25.1-13

The gospels set for the next three Sundays all look forward to 'the coming of the Son of Man'.

Traditionally, these stories have been understood to be about the second coming of Christ, and that's certainly how Paul understands the teaching of Matthew on which he draws in 1 Thessalonians (today's second reading). There, Paul urges his new converts not to waver: Jesus would return as the Lord of God's kingdom, to vindicate them and reward those who had died.

The story of the wise and foolish virgins must have been told with a chuckle, but with a sudden silence at the end as the passage reaches its unexpected end—the lock out of the servant-girls on the part of the groom. The servant girls return from buying more oil for the lamps, only to find that the happy couple have returned, and that the bridegroom will not let them back to join the festivities.

This unexpected part of the story is the bit that is meant to make people sit up and listen: for her, Jesus casts Israel as the foolish virgins, who through her sin and rejection of Jesus will find themselves shut out of their own party by the master they thought they knew.

What makes the difference? Wisdom, as celebrated in today's first reading. What is wisdom? It is equipping ourselves to meet the King, and we discover how to do that as the rest of this chapter of Matthew unfolds in the next couple of weeks.
