THE PASSION ACCORDING TO MARK

This year, Year B in the cycle of readings, we're reading Mark's account of the Passion of Jesus. We've been noticing how short and pithy Mark's Gospel is –fast moving and spare with the details, but when it comes to telling of the Passion Mark is much more detailed –one third of his Gospel is given over to it. Intriguing we'll notice how he refers to specific places in Jerusalem, and this has given rise to the idea that it began as a kind of liturgy in Jerusalem –something like the Stations of the Cross in the later Church. That's to say, it's a text distilled from the experience of the early Christians walking reflectively in Jerusalem –recalling the events at specific locations as they went.

One of the striking things to notice as you hear this Passion is that Jesus is left more and more alone: his friends leave him, Peter denies him, the Jewish authorities condemn him, the Roman soldiers reject and abuse him, and he ends on the cross feeling God has abandoned him too. Our attention is mercilessly focussed on this one figure –God is now working from the heart of Jesus –there is no intervention from heaven- God is in and with this mortal man, who is helpless and about to suffer a terrible death. This is where God chooses to be and to declare himself; and as we walk through the events of this week together this is how we will see and hear God calling us to himself.
